Hi all,

The Ulster County Legislature Ways and Means committee just voted on their recommendation for funding for UCLA in the 2020 budget. They are recommending a 10% cut for the full legislature to vote on. (Total of \$84,500.) My impression is that the full legislature tends to accept the recommendation of the Ways and Means committee. It looks like the full Legislature meets at 7:00 PM tonight but I don't have an agenda for that meeting.

So--PHEW! As a reminder, here are the numbers the UCLA Selection Committee came up with at this level:

Since we have access to the Cahill grant funds for ebooks, this would leave us in very good shape.

I want to point out that the original proposal was to keep us at full funding and there was truly no objection to funding UCLA. It's my impression that the 10% cut was somewhat symbolic so that they could show that they are asking all orgs to make sacrifices. Legislator Bartels, in particular, spoke very powerfully in favor of the services we are providing, the fact that they serve all Ulster County residents equally, and that they offer a lifeline for residents during the COVID shutdown. Legislator Donaldson, as always, spoke strongly in support of what UCLA does. A couple of Legislators shared personal stories of how they are using online library resources themselves. Legislator Walter voiced her strong support of funding libraries in theory but proposed the 10% cut in what I sensed was a spirit of fairness. Even those who voted in favor of the cut, voiced their desire to let it be known that they are in favor of funding the libraries but are being asked to make tough decisions and their vote should not be seen as them not supporting their libraries. They were almost apologetic.

I wish you all could have heard the discussion--you're doing good work, folks!
